This is a one (1) day class designed to teach strategies, philosophies and concepts to enhance single officer response to high threat incidents. Class size is limited to 18 students per day.

Single Officer Response to High Threat Incidents

This course is designed to teach strategies, philosophies, and concepts to enhance single officer response to high threat incidents. In law enforcement's current environment, it may not be possible for officers to wait for additional support to arrive on scene before entry into an active threat environment is required. Officers are empowered to engage the active or high threat situation upon arrival, without waiting for additional officers. Research has shown the failure of four officer tactics due to delays in arrival, lack of resources or how quickly the sudden high intensity incident develops. This course will build the confidence of the officer to enter an active or high threat environment, search hallways, rooms and confront the threat without the benefit of a multiple officer response. This is a dry-fire class, and no ammunition is required. Students must supply empty duty weapon, duty belt, empty carbines are also welcome as issued (not mandatory).

Topics covered include:

Hallway and intersection navigation, doorway and room entries, limited penetration, hand thrown IED response, close quarters edged weapon defense and resaction to stimulus.

Instructor Bio:

Andy Russell is the owner of Tactical Resource LLC. and is currently a Special Agent with a state investigative agency specializing in officer involved critical incidents. Andy is also an agency tactics and firearms instructor. Previously Andy was full-time law enforcement training officer with OPOTA focusing on special operations tactics, firearms, subject control, and SWAT. Andrew developed courses that include the current Ohio precision rifle re-qualification course of fire and target system, building search instructor, mobile active threat instructor, SORAT instructor, tactical weapons deployment, warrant service, in and around vehicles, close quarters combatives for special operations and others. He codeveloped SORAT, counter ambush, concealed carry for off-duty, and the tactical medical program. Andy has been a law enforcement officer for thirty years, still serves as a reserve deputy sheriff on a busy central Ohio SWAT team and is a US Army combat veteran.
